By substituting the average grade for minority zeroes, the result is more fair to the pilots and can be done automatically by the scoring software.

This is an unnecessary requirement of IAC Unlimited competitors and should be taken back to the purpose it was intended to serve, to allow US Team members to fly at International, FAI-sanctioned, events. Approval for this Rule Change has been obtained from the National Aeronautic Association, effective beginning January 1, 2008.
08-13	Poehlmann	Balances the relative values of the Known, Free, and Unknown in Intermediate with Advanced and Unlimited.	5.5.8	Change "150K" to "175K"	The current ratios between the Known, Free and Unknown (or Flights 1, 2, & 3 in Sportsman) are:  1:1:1 in Sportsman 1:1:0.79 in Intermediate 1:1.3:1.2 in Advanced 1:1.4:1.3 in Unlimited.  This change will bring the ratios to:  1:1:1 in Sportsman 1:1:0.92 in Intermediate 1:1.3:1.2 in Advanced 1:1.4:1.3 in Unlimited  for a more consistent progression.

The minimum time may be waived entirely if there is unanimous agreement among all pilots in the effected category. Practice of Unknown programs is prohibited.	The minimum time for review of the Unknown can be lowered slightly without compromising safety. The shorter time period will make it easier to fly the Unknown as the second flight Program should weather conditions threaten to limit the total number of contest flights. If weather conditions merit, the minimum time can be waived entirely in the interest of completing at least two contest flight, if all pilots within the effected category agree to it.
