IAC Open

East and West 2013

2013 WAS THE INAUGURAL YEAR FOR THE IAC OPEN

East and West Championships. The IAC Open East and West are regional aerobatic competitions with a national title for the winners of each category. This year the Wildwoods Acroblast in Lower Township, New Jersey, at Cape May Regional Airport (WWD) held the IAC Open East in June. The Beaver State at Eastern Oregon Regional Airport (PDT) in Pendleton, Oregon, hosted the IAC Open West in August.

Twenty-six pilots competed at Wildwoods. The contest had a late start due to weather preventing arrivals.

Contest Director Craig Wisman kept the word out that the contest was on hold for them, encouraging most to wait-out the weather and make the trip. Competition commenced on Saturday afternoon. Three flights for each category were complete by Sunday afternoon in time for most everyone to make it home in daylight. Long summer days make this possible.

Morey's entertainment and Morey's Piers were prime sponsors at Wildwoods, which has great box and a family-friendly resort location. This is the East Coast contest that attracts the most attendance from

competitor families because they have so much fun at the beach while a family member flies, then enjoy all of the good company in the evening. MT-Propeller and Para-Phernalia parachutes also provided support.

Contest Director John Smutny reports that 18 pilots competed at Pendleton. Forecast weekend thunderstorms, mechanical problems, and western fires thinned attendance. Those who made it found excellent conditions for aerobatic competition. Thunderstorms held off until well after the end of the contest.

Pendleton had sponsorship from many sources including Lightspeed, B&C Specialty Products, King Schools, Oregon Aero, Softie Parachutes, Northwest Insurance, Hooker Harness, Aurora Jet Center, Transwestern Aviation, Cirrus Aviation, and David Clark.

The IAC Open Champions in Unlimited are Goody Thomas in the East and Howard Kirker in the West. Goody is well known as a contender for Unlimited National Champion and member of the U.S. Unlimited Aerobatic Team. He lives with his family in Rochester, New York, and flies for the airlines when not flying his Extra 330SC. His flights were clearly superior, the most memorable performance.

Howard Kirker flies with Livermore, California, Chapter 38. He was the 2013 Southwest Regional Series Advanced Champion in 2012, and flew a Lazer, the airplane of choice also for our IAC Open East Advanced Champion.

Advanced IAC Open Champions are Paul Russo in the East and Kathleen Howell in the West. Paul flies with New England IAC Chapter 35. He has flown the Northeast circuit for years, working up the categories and recently started making the Nationals. Paul still owns and flies his starter airplane, a Super Decathlon, as well as his current competition machine, a Lazer Z-230. Six pilots contended in Advanced at WWD. Mark Stewart with his Panzl S-330 was seven hundredths (0.07) percentage points behind Paul. That was 4.5 points overall; half a point score on one roll.

Kathleen Howell, 2013 IAC Open Advanced Champion West, is a leader with the very powerful Chapter 26 out of Delano, California. She was second in the Southwest Regional Series Intermediate category two years running and has moved up to Advanced only this year. She beat seven other Advanced pilots with her Extra 300 to win the title at the IAC Open West.

In Intermediate, we have Hans Bok at WWD and Christopher Branson at PDT. Hans in his Sukhoi SU-29 cleaned up a six-pilot pack at the IAC Open East to earn the Intermediate title. Hans, a longtime Chapter 35 leader, earned 84.51 percent of possible points, Gold on the Known, Gold on the Unknown, and Silver on the free. A sweet performance.

Chris Branson also served as Co-CD for the Beaver State. It was his third contest as an Intermediate. Chris is a meticulous and good pilot who bested two

other pilots in his Pitts S-2B.

Sportsman had eight pilots at the Open East and five at the Open West. East Champion is Brad Kline from IAC Chapter 11. West Champion is Barbara Higbee from Chapter 67. Brad won the title by flying 25 points behind the leader on the Known, one point behind the leader on the Free, and 51 points ahead of the next best pilot on the Unknown, all with his Pitts S-2C. Barbara won Gold on all three flights flying John Smutny's Wolf Pitts S-1. This was her first contest since 2011.

The IAC Open East Champion for Primary is James Stickney, flying an ACA Super Decathlon in a field of two. The IAC Open West did not fly the Primary category.

Thank you to Margo Chase and Chase Design Group for the IAC Open Logo design. Congratulations to the nine winners of IAC Open Champion titles in the inaugural year. Thank you to IAC Chapter 58, Craig Wisman, and the Wildwoods Acroblast for hosting the first IAC Open Championship East. Thank you to IAC Chapter 77, John Smutny, and the Beaver State for hosting the first IAC Open West. Here is a salute to IAC Open Champions and Championships past and future. May the best pilots claim the titles. You have to be in the box to be a contender. Look forward to seeing you at the 2014 IAC Open regional contests.

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2013 Oshkosh ALLENGE CHALLENGE

AFTER A 33-YEAR ABSENCE, THE SKIES OVER Oshkosh were filled with competitive aerobatic airplanes once again. The aim was to achieve top trophies in five categories: Primary, Sportsman, Intermediate, Advanced, and Unlimited. Twenty-seven pilots attended the first regional competition since the demise of the Fond du Lac Cup in 1999.

The tedious process of organizing an event was proposed by Michael and Audra Hoy, and IAC Chapter 1 out of North Chicago. Audra was the contest director, but her duties were administered in sponsorship, events coordination, all local volunteer assessment,

and implementation of those activities. It was, however, a coordinated event. The idea of having an IAC competition in Oshkosh is not new; the World Aerobatic Championships were held here in 1980, and Leo Loudenslager and Betty Stewart took the Grand Prize for Men and Women, respectively.

There is good reason for an event of this nature to grace the airspace over Wittman Regional Airport. It is home to both the EAA and the International Aerobatic Club. The IAC was formed in 1970 under the direction of Bob Heuer from Maple Grove, Illinois, and within a year quickly amassed 1,000 members. Much



of this also evolved from the U.S. Nationals and the U.S. Aerobatic Team. Several directors have held the helm over the years magnifying new chapter regimes emerging within the ranks of the International Aerobatic Club. Aerobatic contests are tightly scripted manuscripts in the world of aerial ballet. It is far different from the crowd-generating air show where the surface level remains the ultimate success, and gate receipts dictate the outcome of the show.

Michael Hoy had planned this contest about three years prior and began tossing it around to the EAA



community and local IAC chapters in hopes of having a Midwest regional event in late August. Directing a Midwest competition in Oshkosh means having a two-week window to allow the exhibitors time to tear down the exhibit areas after AirVenture—no small task. An event held in Spencer, Iowa, and Canada attracts other Midwest contestants, so the dates have to be manipulated to accommodate those other contests. Weather always plays an important role in the planning stages of a contest, and August seems to be the best bet for fair winds, blue skies, and moderate temps.







The facilities at EAA and the IAC building on the grounds seem to be the most logical consideration for hosting the Air Maneuvers Challenge, but hangar space can be at a premium. Michael then proposed offering the two local FBOs an opportunity to house airplanes, but then realized the EAA grounds had ample space to hangar the aircraft at no cost to IAC members. This was quickly decisive in accommodating the 27 entries and their guests. Close to 100 volunteers stepped up to the plate to help out in a variety of tasks that made this event a first-class affair.

Airspace considerations are everyone's top priority in planning a contest. This event went through a host of painstaking preparations for safety, ease of exit/entry, and, above all, good visibility for the judging concerns.

The aerobatic box had to be moved 500 feet from its original plan to allow for local transient traffic to

enter and egress without disruption of normal flight activities.
Once the box was frozen, Friday appeared out of nowhere and registration commenced with practice slots following in short order.

The Players

Audra Hoy is a marketing, communications, and publicist director. She is the granddaughter of the late, great Paul H. Poberezny, founder of EAA. Audra recently took a position with Women in Aviation, International. The skills she implemented at the Air Maneuvers Challenge involved coordinating activity in local industry for the T-shirts, awards trophies, banquet facilitation, and a host of enterprising endeavors that warrant honorable mention. Audra is a mother, certificated pilot, and a great pleasure to work with. Her qualifications excel in a variety of missions—which may be summed up as exponentially skillful.

Audra's husband, Michael Hoy, is a professional pilot, flying 747s for UPS. Besides a demanding schedule, he entertains himself in the aerobatic world by flying an original 150-hp 1978 American Champion Decathlon with fixed-pitch prop. He is currently constructing a Laser 200 similar to the airplane Leo Loudenslager flew to his World Championship. He took second place in the Sportsman category at the contest this year. Mike was the

originator of the event, where he transformed his multiple tasks into a very successful contest. When not flying, Mike also assumes the duties of family man, entertaining his daughter, Charlie, on the aspects of flight, which seem to run in the family.

Doug Partl is president of IAC Chapter 1. He was instrumental in planning, innovating, and executing the Air Maneuvers Challenge. He and his crew from Northern Illinois brought excitement, contestants, and an array of vibrancy to the contest.

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


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
